## Merry Christmas from the NMM





### HOLDEN HEROES A RETROSPECTIVE 1948-2017



Holden's finest and most important machines, never before seen under one roof!

Holden Heroes: 1948 to 2017 A Retrospective is a showcase of 18 of the most special vehicles from Holden's Heritage Collection on display at the National Motor Museum.

The National Motor Museum has partnered with GM Australia & New Zealand to exhibit some of Australia's most significant motoring history.

On display is the amazing Hurricane (1969); the unique Torana GTR-X (1970) and the fantastic and brave design of the EFIJY (2005). There is also the Number One Holden (1948) and the very last Australian made Holden, a VF Commodore Series II SS Redline (2017) as well as the significant 'millionth' vehicles produced by Holden.
